Present perfect (affirmative, negative and interrogative)

Just, already, yet vs still, ever/never, recently, lately.

If clauses – Types 0, 1, 2 and 3

Time clauses with *as soon as/ as long as/ when / after / before*

Expressions of past, present and future time (now, then, today, tomorrow, yesterday next week, last month, the day before yesterday, the day after tomorrow, in three days' time etc.)
